MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



The whole world was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020. Korowa moved to distance learning while continuing to navigate the challenges of life in lockdown. Masks were worn in a bid to halt the spread of the virus and a whole new raft of compliance measures were swiftly implemented and frequently changed in response to government and health advice.

Throughout the lockdown periods, classes continued at a distance, aided by technology. Lessons were delivered by video, live class interaction through Microsoft Teams while School events and Assemblies were live streamed. We played games, created dance and music performances, trained with each other and continued to have fun even though we weren't able to physically be together. So much was achieved online, that until recently, we wouldn't have thought possible. Some year levels of students spent 21 weeks in remote learning over the year.

COVID-19 created hard times for our families and young people alike. The School supported families through discounted tuition fees and responded to individual circumstances of financial hardship. Throughout the lockdown periods, Korowa continued to provide on-site supervision for the children of front-line workers and those who could not work from home. Korowa was able to maintain staff and enrolment numbers throughout 2020. Work continued, within the limits of COVID-19 restrictions, on the Sports and Wellbeing Centre and Junior School playground. The playground was completed on schedule and proved to be a much-needed resource as students began to return to school during the transition from lockdown. The refurbishment of the Senior School corridors, Drama Courtyard and Hall social spaces were also completed as part of scheduled works during the 2020 summer break. The new Korowa River Campus at Como Park came to fruition thanks to Korowa's partnership with Wesley College.

Rather than dwelling on what we had lost and missed, we learnt to deal with complex and volatile situations. We determined what we would preserve going forward and what we could reinvent that builds on the best of the past.

There will be days to celebrate ahead and all of us look forward to the time when we can socialise and enjoy the contact with friends we've missed for many months. We had thought that 2020 would give us the opportunity to celebrate our 130 years of Korowa, but there will be even more to look forward to in 2021.

MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL CHAIR



2020 taught us all to expect the unexpected and to remain nimble and prepared to alter course on a daily basis. Throughout 2020 the Board remained conscious of the work and effort the Executive made to support the staff and students through this period of uncertainty. Student and staff anxiety levels remain high and the need for welfare support has never been greater.

- The securing of key staff members to assist with the rollout of new outdoor education programs and marketing initiatives as well as a new focus on improving the School's sports program. Not many schools of our size can boast of having World, Olympic and Commonwealth Champions on their staff!

- Reappointing Helen Carmody as Principal of Korowa for a second contract term commencing 2021.
- The incredible success of transitioning the school from face-to-face learning to a distance learning environment.
- The work undertaken to re-engage with Alumni and acknowledging the important part they play in Korowa's history and future.

The School Council has played an important role in supporting the Executive Team considering the enormous issues they have dealt with over the preceding 12 months. This role will continue into the foreseeable future. Focus will remain on student and staff welfare whilst exploring new education initiatives. We remain excited to continue to engage with our community and to celebrate our 130th (+1) year.

The School Community remains indebted to the work of the Korowa Foundation in supporting students through the scholarship and bursary programs and the oversight of the philanthropic strategy.

OUR Students



At Korowa we celebrate every child as an individual. We cherish our students' unique attributes and welcome the diverse backgrounds and experiences they bring to our School.

- Our students speak more 25 languages at home. They were born in more than 20 countries. Their parents have come from even more countries.
- Our students travel from more than 70 postcodes across Melbourne to come to Korowa each day.
- 30% of our students are children and/or grandchildren of Korowa alumni.

Over 750 students from ELC - Year 12 attend Korowa each day. Attendance is recorded and managed by teachers in the Synergetic attendance management system.

In the Junior School, teachers record student attendance at the beginning of the day and after lunch. If a student is absent from School and the School has not been informed of the reason for the absence, the student's parents/guardians are contacted.

In the Senior School, teachers record student attendance each lesson. If a student is marked absent for their first two periods and the School has not been informed of the reason for the student's absence, then the student's parents/guardians are contacted. Absences that occur after this time are managed on a case by case basis.

All late arrivals and early leavers sign in or out at Junior School Reception (Junior School students) or Student Services (Senior School). Parents of students who are leaving early must notify the School before the student can sign out of the School. Alternatively, students can be in the presence of a parent/guardian when signing out of the School. Students who are unwell are assessed by the School Nurse, who determines whether the student should be collected by a parent/guardian. Students who demonstrate persistent absence and/or lateness are supported by the relevant staff member, according to principles outlined in the Korowa Student Behaviour Management Policy.

During Distance Learning attendance records continued to be maintained daily via the Synergetic database as per the directions of the DET.




2020 Attendance Rate

COMMUNITY SATISFACTION

Parent Satisfaction

High parent satisfaction occurs when parents feel that their child is safe; where parents are welcome, engaged and supported; and where teachers provide help and support for all students, catering for all abilities. They also seek a school where their children are provided with good levels of resources, including ICT, and appropriate preparation for the transition to the next school year.

Across the year parents were given opportunities to provide feedback relating to both their experience and that of their child/ren's through both formal and informal channels. This information gathered from surveys and interactions with parents informed the decisions made regarding not only the structures and protocols for Distance Learning, but future planning beyond 2020.

Overall feedback from surveys conducted around the delivery of the Distance Learning program was overwhelmingly positive and included comments as follows:

Korowa needs to be applauded for the speed at which they moved to distance education. Communication about the program was on the whole, timely and thorough and the focus on student wellbeing is to be commended. I hope Korowa is one of the schools which is able to rejoice in the quality outcomes of their students, both personally and educationally once things truly settle.

Student Satisfaction

Students across the school were offered informal opportunities to voice their impressions of their Korowa experience, particularly in Distance Learning. The information gathered from interactions with students, parents and staff informed the decisions made regarding not only the structures and protocols for Distance Learning, but future planning beyond 2020.

In addition, all students from Years 4-12 participated weekly 'Pulse' wellbeing surveys administered by Educator Impact, and students in Years 9-12 completed Mission Australia's Youth Survey. The students' thoughtful responses informed both our wellbeing practices and the development of Korowa's Mental Health Strategy, which will be implemented in 2021 and beyond.

Year 12 students also completed an Exit Survey and rated these as their top 5 elements at Korowa:

- Access to quality materials and resources
- High quality teachers
- Teachers have up to date knowledge and skills
- Teachers enthusiastic about teaching
- Teachers set high standards

We are very happy with Korowa's response and communications during the COVID-19 event. Very appreciative of the teachers and the supporting staff (IT helpdesk) efforts in making the transition to distance learning as smooth as possible for the children. Thankyou.

Distance Learning was very well planned and executed by the teachers and to their credit, they made themselves available 24/7.

Distance Learning at Korowa helped maximise time during school to complete work and to focus during spares to complete homework and to be able to afford a small break before continuing to study.

Staff and teachers should be commended for the program and effort put into IT infrastructure and classroom planning sessions. My daughter was entertained for the entire school day and beyond, so as a working parent, thank you for an amazing job well done.

Staff Satisfaction

Throughout 2020 staff completed the Educator Impact (EI) Staff Pulse survey once per week. The results showed that staff settled well into working back at school following the lockdown period.

Throughout the year staff advised that they were positive and felt supported.

Feedback from staff indicated that the areas causing the most pressure were associated with making sure our students had the best finish to the year.

In November 68% of staff indicated they were feeling great or positive and 32% indicated they were in the middle.

Korowa has never been prouder of its staff, both teaching and support staff, for their dedication to students, support of one another and ability to be agile, pivoting from classroom teaching to Distance Learning numerous times across the year. As outlined in our Strategic Plan, we are committed to attracting and retaining quality teachers and supporting staff to ensure we can continue to deliver an outstanding educational program.

RESULTS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Academic

- Year 11 student, Sarah Whalen made it through to the finals of the Senior division of the Public Speaking Competition from over 750 entries.
- Year 11 student Phoebe Shumack won Best in Age Group Years 9-12 at the Strathcona Film Festival, Co-Video short film Awards. The film she entered was titled "The Dream".
- Year 7 student Tessa Plant was chosen to perform with the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra in the Waltzing Matilda Virtual Choir Performance for Anzac Day.
- Snigdha Arora, Mia Pistofian and Ella Rowley were selected as state finalists, out of thousands of entries across Victoria, in the Microsoft Al For Good Challenge. The Challenge is a designthinking challenge to dream up a creative way that Artificial Intelligence can be used to make a difference in the world. The girls' team project was undertaken as part of the Innovation Accelerator course at the start of Term 2.
- A number of students achieved excellent results in the Alliance Française competition – there were 4,060 Victorian participants in Years 3-10 and 824 participants in the Years 11 and 12 Oral and Written Exams. Korowa had two finalists in Junior School, two finalists in Cripps and eight finalists in Senior School.

Our 4x50m Freestyle relay team finished in 4th place in the 9/10 age group, one athlete placed 4th in the 9/10 year 50m Breaststroke, one athlete finished 2nd in the 11 year old 50 Backstroke and 3rd in 50m Butterfly events.

Music

- Total 2020 enrolments: 166 private music enrolments (not including all of Year 2, 3, 5 and 6 classroom instrumental programs).
- There were 193 students enrolled in co-curricular ensembles (not including the Junior School Choir, Mini Singers or Year 6 Band).
- All large ensembles continued online due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- In Term 3, students had the opportunity to submit recordings via Teams as part of a 'Virtual Concert'. Each student's work received a written report (by the Director of Music) and a certificate.
- The Australian Music Examinations Board examinations were very disrupted in 2020, due to COVID-19 restrictions. Live examinations for the highest level examinations were postponed until December. We are pleased to announce the following exceptional results:

One student, Jacqueline Deng, was successful in the A.Mus.A examination in Violin and another two students, Charlotte Li and Chantelle Yin, were successful in the L.Mus.A examination, also in Violin.

- Classroom ensembles or soloists performed at the various Year level presentation mornings. The Year 7 strings were particularly impressive, given that they had co-written their own piece, and it had an Australian 'outback' flavour. Aboriginal story telling was also integrated in the preparation of the piece.
- The 'Happy' Project was launched at the start of Term 2, with approximately 100 students opting to be involved across the school in this virtual performance.

Service

- Korowa partnered with Frontyard, an organisation that supports young people to develop pathways out of homelessness to make facemasks for homeless young people across Melbourne and Victoria. Over 100 masks were made and donated.
- Five students were selected to be part of the Melbourne City Mission Youth Action Group. Together they produced three podcasts, each focusing on different groups and communities affected by youth homelessness – people who identify as LGBTIQ+, First Nations Australians, and young people who have experienced family violence.
- Service and generosity are part of the Korowa values and active participation in multiple service events and ventures is encouraged. Unfortunately, this year due to COVID-19 the many events and ventures were cancelled. Instead of face to face activities we moved to events that the students could do at home and with their families. Kindness projects were created where girls were encouraged to find ways to do random acts of kindness within their 5 km radius and within their families including writing letters to elderly community members.
- We supported the Anglicare's Christmas Toy and Food Drive. Due to COVID-19 the drive was all on line and our staff and families were encouraged to support Anglicare's Christmas drive through this site.

Laura, 2020 Drama Captain, was invited to perform in Top Class Drama as part of the VCE Season of Excellence 2021. Top Class Drama is a representative sample of works that achieved outstanding scores in the 2020 VCE performance examinations. Laura presented Irena Sendler, based on the life and humanitarian work of Irena who was known for serving in the Polish Underground Resistance during World War II. Laura is studying Law (Honours)/Arts at Monash University.



Cassandra was the recipient of the University of Melbourne Principals' Scholarship. Achieving an ATAR of 98.9, she received a first round offer into the guaranteed pathway to study Veterinary Medicine at The University of Melbourne. This accelerated program allows a student to qualify as a veterinarian in six years. The Doctor of Veterinary Medicine is usually a four year degree, but this graduate degree package grants students a one year of credit as they complete Veterinary Bioscience subjects in a Bachelor of Science.



Lara is one of 45 students selected from over 2000 applicants across Victoria who have studied Art or Studio Arts to be accepted to the Top Arts exhibition held at the NGV. Lara's animation, 'Untitled' is made up of over a 1000 digitally drawn images and put to the music of Debussy's 'Claire De Lune'. It draws from her experiences as an autistic person, and her attempt to find a place in a world that refuses to accept people like herself. Despite this, the narrative is deliberately ambiguous, prompting the viewer to examine their own place in the world.




